

70B – Health Services Administration Officer



Duties: At the operational level, plans, coordinates, monitors, evaluates, and advises unit Commanders and staff in both medical and non-medical areas of patient evacuation, treatment and tracking; preventive medicine, organizational administration, supply, training, operations, transportation, and maintenance. Duties are performed PRIMARILY in TOE and occasionally TDA organizations, both CONUS and OCONUS. (DA PAM 600-4, 2019)



- Education Delay (DL) selection board takes place <u>after Active Duty/Reserve</u>
 Forces Duty selection is complete and <u>prior</u> to Active Duty Branching
- Cadets/LTs not selected for DL will retain their Active Duty/Reserve Forces Duty Selection
- (1) Audiology (72C) AuD in Audiology
- (2) Biochemistry (71B) PhD in Biochemistry Toxicology, Physiology, or Chemistry
- (3) Research Psychology **(71F)** Doctoral in Research, Behavioral, or Experimental Psychology
- (4) Entomology **(72B)** MS/PhD in Entomology or Biological Sciences with a concentration in Entomology
- (5) Healthcare Administration (70A) MS in Healthcare Administration from a program approved by the Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Management Education
- (6) Microbiologist (71A) MS/PhD in Microbiology, Immunology, Parasitology, or Biology
- (7) Nuclear Medical Science Officer (72A) MS/PhD in Health, Medical, Nuclear, or Applied Physics, or Nuclear Engineering
- (8) Optometry (67F) Doctorate of Optometry
- (9) Podiatry (67G) Doctorate of Podiatric Medicine
- (10) Research Psychology (71F) Doctorate degree in Research, Behavioral, or Experimental Psychology

- No more than 32 years a
- No more than 32 years at the start of flight training
- Meet Army APFT and height/weight requirements IAW AR 600-9



65B Army-Baylor University Doctoral Program in Physical Therapy (DPT)

 - Program Admission Requirements
 - DPT Application Timelines
- Virtual tours offered (60 slots per session; sign up on our website)
- Apply through the Physical Therapy Computerized Application System (PTCAS)
 - Opens in July and closes in October

65A: Occupational Therapy Doctorate (OTD)

- Program Start in January 2022. Competitive applicant has:
 - Baccalaureate degree in either the Arts or Sciences
 - Have a grade point average of at least 3.1 or above
 - Strong academics in anatomy and physiology, psychology, physics, and behavioral sciences
 - GRE combined Verbal and Quantitative scores of 300, with minimum 145 verbal
 - 40 documented observation hours in of occupational therapy practice
- Eligibility:
 - Be a commissioned officer in the SP Corps as a 65A
 - Be less than 35 years of age
 - Be a U.S. citizen
 - Meet the DA medical fitness standards

- 9-month didactic at Fort Sam Houston (47-graduate credits)
- 12-month dietetic internship at Medical Treatment Facility with operational unit rotations (1,353 clinical hours)

- \$42K-61K salary and entitlements per year
- Full medical and dental benefits

- Cadets do NOT have to branch into a medical AOC to apply to the Inter-service Physician Assistant Program

Army Medical Education

<u>Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS)</u>

- The Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences is situated on the grounds of the world class Walter Reed National Military Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland.
- Students at USU represent the amazing diversity of America and come from all geographic, socioeconomic, racial, ethnic, and cultural backgrounds.
- All students study tuition free and are paid a \$64,000 or higher salary to train as future physicians and medical leaders.
- USU features an extensive year-round curriculum that focuses on medical science, disease prevention, health promotion, and leadership training that is nearly 700 hours longer than those found at other U.S. medical schools.
- Medical students enter the university as commissioned officers in one of the four uniformed services: Army, Navy, Air Force, or Public Health Service. No prior service is required for admission to USU.
- Upon completion of residency, graduates are promoted to the rank of O-3 and fulfill their seven-year service requirement

Education Delay for Medical Training

- Incoming HPSP Student Stats FY18
 - GPA- 3.6
 - Composite MCAT- 508 (76th Percentile)
 - Similar to USUHS
- Minimum Application Criteria
 - GPA- 3.2
 - Composite MCAT- 500
- Unlikely to be approved for Ed Delay with poor GPA and MCAT scores

Army Medical Education Cont.

Health Professions Scholarship Program (HPSP)

168 Allopathic and Osteopathic medical schools

- 275 graduates annually (80% of active duty physicians)
- Commissioned as 2LT in US Army Reserve (IRR)
- 100% tuition and authorized books/fees paid
- Monthly stipend (\$2,330.78/month) for 10.5 months each year
- Military pay (approximately \$6,000) annually for 45 days (remaining 1.5 months of the calendar year)
 Active Duty Training
- Obligation is 1 year on active duty for each year of sponsorship in HPSP (2 years minimum) or 4 years with the Accession Bonus

Army Graduate Medical Education:

- 29-33% of active duty Medical Corps officers are in GME at any given time
- · Largest program in the military: 1568 physicians
 - 1431 training in in-house programs; 128 in Army-sponsored civilian training; 9 in educational delay
- All Specialties
 - 11 training hospitals; 71 residencies; 73 fellowships
- All eligible programs accredited and in good standing by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME)
- 96% first time specialty board pass rate (civilian 86-87%)
