Course Description:

The purpose of this course is to prepare the AN officer to function in mid-level leadership and management positions throughout the AMEDD. The course provides executive skills content with emphasis on personal leadership skills development, defining interpersonal effectiveness, human resources management and decision making methods which facilitate effective management of personnel, logistics, training and fiscal responsibility. The course is geared toward company grade officers preparing for the clinical nurse OIC or staff role. Completion of a dL prerequisites is required upon arrival to course.

These programs are offered to the International Community through the International Military Education Training Program (IMET) and Foreign Military Sales (FMS), U.S. Army Security Assistance Training Field Activity (SATFA), and the U.S. Army Medical Department Center and School Health Readiness Center of Excellence.

Course Description:

The course provides executive leadership skills content with a focus on major trends in healthcare affecting the military health care delivery system. This course is geared toward officers in the rank of major and above. Completion of a dL phase I is required prior to enrolling in phase II.

OB/GYN Nursing

Course Length: 16 weeks

Course Description:

This course prepares the nurse to function effectively in obstetric, gynecologic and neonatal areas to include inpatient, outpatient and deployment setting. Instruction include the fundamentals of OB/GYN nursing, high risk and complicated pregnancy, assessment and care of the newborn, family planning and gynecology, leadership and readiness training, legal considerations in OB/GYN, and identifying and managing OB/GYN emergencies. Prerequisites include one year of clinical nursing experience and an interest in the field of maternal/child care.

Critical Care Nursing

Course Length: 18 weeks

Course Description:

This course provides instructions on the fundamentals of Critical Care and core emergency care across the life span for any critical care setting. The course also focuses on responsibilities in direct patient care, patient and staff education in TDA and TOE settings. Prerequisites include one year of recent in-patient clinical nursing experience and an interest in the care of critically ill patients.

The course focuses on the integration of theory and current research into clinical practice and the

development of individual management and leadership styles as both an officer and a nurse. Areas of instruction include current trends in mental health nursing, therapeutic process, development theories, psychiatric diagnosis and problems, group therapy, psychobiology, therapeutic milieu, nursing management and military mission readiness as a psychiatric/behavioral health nurse. Prerequisites include one year of clinical nursing experience and an interest in the field of psychiatry.
