CW5 Lee Nelson enlisted the U.S. Army after graduating high school. He graduated from Basic Training at Fort Sill, Okla., laying the foundation for 29 years of military service that has covered a full spectrum of assignments.

Assignments include Biomedical Equipment (BMET) Repair Specialist/Team Leader, Landstuhl Regional Medical Center, Germany; Squad Leader/Computerized Tomography Repairer, 32nd Medical Logistics Battalion; Chief Equipment Management Branch, Walter Reed Army Institute of Research and Womack Army Medical Center; Unit Maintenance Officer, 51st Medical Logistics Company; Battalion Maintenance Officer, 261st Multifunctional Medical Battalion; Modality Manager, Technology Assessment Requirements Analysis, U.S. Army Medical Materiel Agency; and Deputy Project Manager, Medical Devices Assemblage Management, USAMMA. He previously served as the

Brigade Maintenance Officer, 65th Medical Brigade; and Command Chief Warrant Officer, Army Medical Logistics Command; and now serves as the Command Chief Warrant Officer of the U.S. Army Medical Center of Excellence, JBSA-Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

CW5 Nelson's deployments include Intrinsic Action Rotation (Kuwait) and Operation Joint Guard (Bosnia). He also deployed twice in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom (Iraq). Additionally, he has completed overseas assignments in Germany and Korea. Academic achievements include an Associates of Applied Science in Biomedical Electronic Technology from Aims Community College; a Bachelor of Liberal Studies from Excelsior University; and a Master of Science in Occupational Health and Safety from Columbia Southern University.
